

“Thus says the Lord,” the prophet announced to the exiles in Babylon. The Lord, the Creator of Israel, who made a way in the sea, a path in the mighty waters, in order to bring the Israelites out of bondage in Egypt, will now end the captivity of the exiles and bring them home: “I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth; do you not perceive it?”

The Lord made a way for us, too, a pathway for following Jesus, when God created the First Baptist Church of Christ in Macon in 1826. And we perceive God’s newness springing forth in our midst today as we install Julie Whidden Long as our pastor and look to the future that God has for us.

“Comfort, O comfort, my people,” God called to the prophet. “Speak tenderly to Jerusalem.” A hurting people must know that the Lord cares for them, that they belong to God, carried in the arms of the Lord like motherless lambs, if they are to trust confidently in the reconciliation and homecoming that God intends.

Our pastor has called us, too, to speak tenderly to each other, to ask for and offer forgiveness, to speak with truth, not pride, and receive each other with kindness, tenderheartedly, so that we will become a model of authentic belonging, of how the love of God can bring unity out of diversity.

“Listen,” said the Lord to the remnant of Jacob, whom God has borne from birth, carried from the womb. “I am with you, and I will forgive your transgressions and save you. I will have compassion for you and love you with an everlasting love,” said the Lord.

We hear God’s forgiveness in these words. We have not, in ages past or recent days, always loved others as Christ loved us. We have spoken and acted in ways that made others feel diminished and excluded. But God’s grace and compassion will help us truly love one another and be the people “of Christ” in this place.

“Sing a new song. Shout for joy. Do not fear,” the Lord proclaimed to the exiles in Babylon, announcing the divine vision for all peoples, a covenant of peace. The Lord, Creator and Redeemer, will gather both the outcasts of Israel and the peoples of the nations and make them one people, God’s inclusive community, composed of all who follow the way of the Lord in justice and righteousness.

We sing and rejoice today as well, one song, expressed in all our different voices, but united as we commit ourselves anew to the vision that our church “nurtures authentic faith and belonging, loves and serves courageously, and affirms the image of God in all people.”
